

Camping Rules

Check-In

Every guest is obligated to check in at the reception upon arrival.

Check-in times are from 1:00 PM to 9:00 PM (may vary during the off-season).

Check-in before 1:00 PM is only possible by arrangement with the site management.

Check-Out

The stay must be settled by 10:00 a.m. on the day of departure at the latest. The site must be released by 11:30 AM. Late check-out after 11:30 AM is only possible by arrangement with the site management.

Reception

The reception is closed between 11:30 AM and 1:00 PM, and after 9:00 PM.

During these times, site management can only be contacted in case of emergencies.

Visitors

Visitors of registered guests must be registered at the reception. Site management reserves the right to refuse visits. A fee may be charged for visitors if necessary. Visitors must park their vehicles in front of the barrier.

Motor Vehicles

Motor vehicles may only be used for arrival and departure, as well as for excursions. Driving around the site is prohibited.

A maximum speed of 10 km/h (walking pace) applies. Between 10:00 PM and 7:00 AM, all vehicular traffic is prohibited, and the barrier is closed.

Pets

Pets must be kept on a short leash. The owner is responsible for keeping them clean and must not leave them unattended. Pets must not disturb the immediate surroundings and must relieve themselves at designated areas or suitable locations outside the campground. Any mess must be promptly cleaned up by the owner.

Quiet Hours

Quiet hours must be observed strictly from 10:00 PM to 7:00 AM.

Music of any kind and noise must not disturb the neighborhood and are prohibited after 10:00 PM.

Fire / BBQ

Open fires are strictly prohibited on the campground at all times, including in fire pits, due to the risk of sparks and smoke nuisance to neighbors. BBQing is only allowed with charcoal grills and gas grills. Disposable grills should not be used directly on the lawn.

Validity

Presence on our campground implies the implicit acceptance of these rules, the site regulations, and public regulations. Site management may take measures to ensure peace, order, and cleanliness, may hold those responsible for damages accountable, and may expel guests who do not adhere to the rules.
